Discussion Guide “Accept or Decline” Pastor Daniel Floyd

Starter What’s the best invitation you’ve ever received? Was it to a wedding, a concert, a sporting event, dinner with friends, or something else? What made that invitation so memorable?

Sermon Summary

God extends two life-changing invitations to every person: to enter a relationship with Jesus and to share that hope with others. Discover practical, biblical ways to let your light shine through everyday conversations, authentic relationships, and a life that points people to Christ.

ACT

As you absorb sermons, read, or participate in group discussion, take notes and make a plan to apply what God’s teaching you.

A (Action): Mark important ideas with an “A” to remind you to take action.

C (Contemplate): Use a “C” to mark ideas you want to process further.

T (Transfer/Teach): If it’s something you need to teach to someone else, note it with a “T.”

Discuss

Choose questions to keep the discussion moving. There’s no need to discuss every question.

1. What makes sharing your faith feel exciting or intimidating to you?
2. How can “being the light” to others look different from trying to win arguments?
3. Where has God already placed you to influence others through your daily life?
4. Who is someone in your life that may be spiritually thirsty and how could you intentionally care for them this week?

5. What is one practical thing you can do this week to become more aware of the opportunities God places in front of you?

Go Deeper

1. Study [Isaiah 6:1–8](#) (Isaiah’s calling). How does experiencing God’s grace prepare us to say, “Here am I. Send me”?
2. Study [Luke 8:26–39](#) (the demon-possessed man). Why do you think Jesus often asked people to begin sharing their story once they’re close to home?
3. Study [Romans 10:13–15](#). What responsibility do believers have in helping others hear the good news?
4. Study [Colossians 4:2–6](#). What does it look like to have conversations that are “full of grace” while pointing people to Christ?

Apply

1. Pray each morning for God to make you aware of one person who needs encouragement or hope that day.
2. Practice sharing your personal testimony in two or three minutes so you’re prepared when opportunities arise.
3. Invite someone—a friend, coworker, neighbor, or family member—to church or into a spiritual conversation this week.
4. Choose one way to intentionally reflect Christ this week through kindness, generosity, patience, or encouragement.

Pray

Here are some prayer points:

1. Pray for boldness to accept God’s invitation to be His witness every day.
2. Ask God to help you recognize opportunities to share His love with those around you.
3. Pray for people in your life who have not yet accepted Christ, asking God to prepare their hearts.
4. Ask the Holy Spirit to produce fruit in your life so others naturally see Jesus through your words and actions.

Leadership Tip

This topic can make people feel guilty or inadequate about sharing their faith. Keep the discussion centered on living as faithful witnesses rather than achieving results, reminding your group that God is responsible for changing hearts while we are responsible for being available, loving people well, and faithfully sharing what Christ has done in our lives.
